



## 2016 BOOST Student Hall of Fame Overview & Guidelines

The BOOST Conference in Palm Springs, California offers an opportunity to highlight student artwork from out-of-school time programs across the nation. The artwork will be displayed throughout the Palm Springs Convention Center and viewed by over 2,200 attendees from around the globe. Seeing the artwork and walking through the gallery reminds us of why we do this work and celebrates the incredible talent that we see in our youth each and every day.

**Goal:** Our goal this year is to have 600 pieces of artwork.

**Theme:** There is no theme for the artwork. We want the students to be able to use their full creativity, and we are looking forward to seeing what they create!

**Artwork submissions can include:**

- Visual art: paintings, drawings, sketches, cartoons, photographs, collage, etc.
- Written work: stories, poems, prose, etc.
- A student idea, providing it fits on a 22x28 inch poster board.
- Sculpture pieces are welcome but they must be hand delivered.

**Submission Guidelines:**

- The artwork should be mounted on poster board (22in x 28in). Smaller pieces of work can be combined on one poster board.
- All artwork must have the name and grade of each student who was involved in the creation of the pieces, as well as the name of the program and the city and state in the lower right hand corner of the board.

Please note: we will not have the ability to have any electrical outlets available for any of the works nor will we have any tables on which to display artwork.

**Here is how it works:**

1. Please complete a Submission Form and return it to us no later than March 18, 2016. Submissions will be accepted until all 600 slots are filled. You will receive an email confirmation that your submission has been accepted.
2. You are responsible for seeing that the artwork gets delivered to the conference. Options include the following:

**Option 1:**

**Mail to:** LACOE, 9300 Imperial Highway, Attn: After School Technical Assistance Unit, ECW Cubicle 3208, Downey, CA 90242. **All artwork must be received by April 1, 2016.**

**Option 2:**

**Deliver to:** The Los Angeles County Office of Education After School Technical Assistance Unit. Please call Lily Madrigal at (562) 401-5335 and advise her that you are bringing artwork so that she may provide you with delivery instructions (such as office location, etc.). **Artwork must be received by April 1, 2016.**

3. The LACOE Technical Assistance Unit has arranged a van to take all the artwork from LA County out to Palm Springs, CA. Please note that we are unable to bring artwork back to Los Angeles after the conference.
4. The BOOST Conference assumes no responsibility for the art pieces and will not be returning any artwork at the end of the conference. Pieces must remain up in the Student Artwork Hall of Fame until 9:00am on Friday, April 29, 2016. Any pieces not claimed by 10:00am that day will be donated to local community-based organizations.
