## Y4Y Learning Modules

### Project-Based Learning

Learn how to engage students in inquiry-based learning and authentic projects. Civic learning and engagement is a great example of project-based learning in action, and is embedded within the module.

### Aligning with the School Day

Explore the “what” and “how” of aligning out-of-school time and expanded learning time experiences with what happens during the school day.

### STEM

Discover how to integrate science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) topics across programming to enhance academic and 21<sup>st</sup> century skill-building.

### Strengthening Partnerships

Gain strategies and tools to add depth and breadth to your program through partnerships with experts and organizations in your community and beyond.

### Family Engagement

Find resources for creating a program culture that enables staff to get to know families, design activities that involve family members, and provide services to support families.
